78.8% of our middle school girls missed less than 19 days of school.

92% of girls in our middle school program reported feeling more confident in their bodies.

of our girls received a C or higher in Reading/Language Arts.


92%

of our girls DID NOT receive disciplinary action (behavior incidents, referrals, etc.).








Programming




